SUBJECT: Delegation of Authority to the D.C. Taxi Commission to Review and Adjust Rates for Time and Distance Metered Taxicab System

ORIGINATING AGENCY: Office of the Mayor


By virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the District of Columbia by section 422(6) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, as amended, 87 Stat. 790, Pub. L. No. 93-198, D.C. Official Code § 1-204.22(6) (2006 Repl.), and pursuant to section 105(a) of the 2005 District of Columbia Omnibus Authorization Act ("Omnibus Act"), approved October 16, 2006, 120 Stat. 2023, D.C. Official Code § 50-381(a) (2008 Supp.), it is hereby **ORDERED** that:

1. The D.C. Taxicab Commission ("Commission") is delegated the Mayor's authority to review and adjust rates necessary for the implementation of the time and distance metered taxicab system for the District of Columbia ("rate making") in accordance with the D.C. Administrative Procedures Act ("DCAPA"), effective October 21, 1968, 82 Stat. 1206, D.C. Official Code § 2-505 (2006 Repl.), provided that the Commission:
 - a. May not implement more than one rate increase per year. Nor may the Commission implement any single increase of more than 5% without the prior approval of the Mayor;
 - b. May not establish any additional charge beyond the fare rate (including, but not limited to a fuel surcharge or fee for group or shared rides) without the prior approval of the Mayor;
 - c. When making rate adjustments, sets rates to the nearest increment that can be programmed into the taximeters at an integer value; and
 - d. Complies with procedures and criteria for rate making as established by the Chairperson of the Commission ("Chairperson").
2. In accordance with Mayor's Order 2007-231, the Chairperson retains the Mayor's delegated authority to establish the procedures and criteria for rate making through rulemaking in accordance with the DCAPA.
3. Any provision in Mayor's Order 2007-231 that is inconsistent with this Order is hereby rescinded.

- 4. The Mayor has discretion to re-delegate his authority under the Omnibus Act by any subsequent Mayor's Order.

- 5. **EFFECTIVE DATE:** This Order shall become effective on June 15, 2009.

No. 93-198, D.C. Official Code §§ 1-204.22 (6) and (11) and 1-204.49 (2008 Supp.), An Act Authorizing the sale of certain real estate in the District of Columbia no longer needed for public purposes, approved August 5, 1939 (53 Stat. 1211; D.C. Official Code §§ 10-801 *et seq.* (2008 Supp.)), section 6 of the Community Development Act of 1975, effective December 16, 1975 (D.C. Law 1-39; D.C. Official Code §§ 6-1005) (2008 Repl.), the Tax Increment Financing Authorization Act of 1998, effective September 11, 1998 (D.C. Law 12-143; D.C. Official Code §§ 2-1217.01 *et seq.*), the Housing Act of 2002, effective April 19, 2002 (D.C. Law 14-114; 49 DCR 1468), including D.C. Official Code §§ 47-857.01 *et seq.* (2008 Supp.), D.C. Official Code § 47-865 (2005 Repl.), and D.C. Official Code § 47-866 (2005 Repl.), the Payments in Lieu of Taxes Act of 2004, effective April 5, 2005 (D.C. Law 15-293, D.C. Official Code §§ 1-308.01 *et seq.*) (2006 Supp.), the Carver 2000 Low-Income and Senior Housing Project Act of 2005, effective October 20, 2005 (D.C. Law 16-33; D.C. Official Code § 47-4605) (2008 Supp.), the Parkside Terrace Economic Development Act of 2006, effective Apr. 4, 2006 (D.C. Law 16-84; D.C. Official Code § 47-4607) (2008 Supp.), the Far Southeast Community Organization Tax Exemption and Forgiveness for Accrued Taxes Act of 2006, effective March 2, 2007 (D.C. Law 16-192; D.C. Official Code § 47-1075) (2008 Supp.), the Square 2910 Residential Development Stimulus Act of 2006, effective March 6, 2007 (D.C. 1. The Department of Housing and Community Development is hereby delegated the authority to monitor and enforce compliance with requirements to provide or

maintain affordable dwelling units in the District of Columbia where such requirements are imposed by:

- a. Legislation providing tax exemptions, tax abatements, or other financial assistance, including D.C. Official Code §§ 47-857.01 *et seq.*, D.C. Official Code § 47-865, D.C. Official Code § 47-866, and legislation providing tax exemptions, tax abatements, or other financial assistance to specific projects (including such legislation set forth in the preamble to this Order);
 - b. Agreements entered into by an agency subordinate to the Mayor or by the former National Capital Revitalization Corporation, RLA Revitalization Corporation, Anacostia Waterfront Corporation, Southwest Waterfront Development Corporation, or Redevelopment Land Agency to sell or lease District-owned property;
 - c. Agreements entered into by the Mayor or a delegee of the Mayor to provide tax increment financing or payment in lieu of taxes financing or to establish the conditions of such financing; and
 - d. Covenants to which the Mayor or a delegee of the Mayor is a party, including covenants related to planned unit developments and the sale or lease of District-owned property.
2. This Order shall not supersede or terminate any authority previously delegated to the Director of the Department of Housing and Community Development to monitor and enforce affordable dwelling unit requirements imposed through other means.
 3. This Order supersedes all previous Mayor's Orders to the extent of any inconsistency.
 4. **EFFECTIVE DATE:** This Order shall be effective immediately.



SUBJECT: Establishment – Public Space Committee

ORIGINATING AGENCY: Office of the Mayor

By virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the District of Columbia by sections 422(2), (6) and (11) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act of 1973, as amended, 87 Stat. 790, Pub. L. No. 93-198, D.C. Official Code §§ 1-204.22(2), (6) and (11) (2008 Supp.), and the District of Columbia Public Space Rental Act, approved October 17, 1968 (82 Stat. 1156, Pub. L. No. 90-596, D.C. Official Code § 10-1101.01 *et seq.* (2008 Repl.)), it is hereby **ORDERED** that:

- I. **Establishment:** There is established in the Government of the District of Columbia a Public Space Committee.
- II. **Purpose:** The Committee shall assure that temporary uses of public space for public and private purposes are consistent with the laws and policies of the District Government.
- III. **Functions:** The Committee shall make final determinations on the approval or denial of all applications for the temporary use of public space, with the following exceptions:
 - A. Routine applications for temporary use of public space or permanent paving improvements delegated to the District Department of Transportation (“DDOT”), Transportation Policy and Planning Administration.
 - B. Applications for temporary use of public space or minor permanent use in circumstances where it is not practicable or necessary to convene the full Committee for which the Chair may make final determinations, reporting such actions to the Committee by regular reports.
 - C. Applications for the use of air space above or below a street or alley under the jurisdiction of the Mayor, pursuant to D.C. Code § 10-1121.01 *et seq.* (2001).
 - D. Approvals for the location and installation of bus shelters which are delegated to the Mass Transit Administration in DDOT.
 - E. Applications for temporary use of streets or alleys by private persons and organizations for activities of a recreational, educational, civic or charitable nature, the issuance of which has been delegated to the Director of D.C. Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency by Mayor’s Order 2008-61, dated April 2, 2008.

F. Applications for permits or approvals for other uses of public space delegated to other government agencies by law, regulations or delegations of authority governing occupancy of public space.

IV. **Committee Composition:**

A. The D.C. Public Space Committee shall be composed of the following members:

1. The Associate Director of the Transportation Policy and Planning Administration of DDOT, who shall serve as Chairperson;
2. The Associate Director of the Transportation Operations Administration of DDOT;
3. The Director of the Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs;
4. The Director of the Office of Planning; and
5. The Secretary of the District of Columbia.

B. A member of the Committee may designate an alternative to represent him or her at the Committee meeting, vesting him or her with the same powers of the Committee member.

V. **Administrative Support:** The District Department of Transportation shall provide the Executive Secretary and staff services required by the Committee.


VI. **Rescission:**





SUBJECT: Delegation of Authority for Acceptance and Distribution of Electronic Records by District Government Agencies

ORIGINATING AGENCY: Office of the Mayor

By virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the District of Columbia by section 422(6) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act of 1973, as amended, 87 Stat. 790, P. L. No. 93-198, D.C. Official Code § 1-204.22(6) (2008 Supp.), it is hereby **ORDERED** that:

1. USE OF ELECTRONIC RECORDS BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

- a. The Mayor has determined that District government agencies may send and accept electronic records and electronic signatures pursuant to section 3502 of the Fiscal Year 2002 Budget Support Act of 2001 (Act), effective October 3, 2001, D.C. Law 14-28, D.C. Official Code § 28-4917 (2008 Supp.).


2. DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY

- a. The Secretary for the District of Columbia is delegated the authority vested in the Mayor under the Act, including, but not limited to:
 - 1. Establishing additional guidelines for the use of electronic records and electronic signatures by governmental agencies;
 - 2. Requiring a governmental agency to submit a plan for the use of electronic records and electronic signatures by the agency to the Office of the Secretary; and
 - 3. Conditioning the use of electronic records and electronic signatures by governmental agencies.
- b. Under this authority, a governmental agency may only use electronic records and electronic signatures after receiving written approval from the Office of the Secretary.

3. EFFECTIVE DATE: This Order shall become effective immediately.
