
By virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the District of Columbia by section 422 (6) and (11) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act of 1973, as amended, 87 Stat. 790, Pub. L. No. 93-198, D.C. Official Code § 1-204.22 (6) and (11) (2008 Supp.), it is hereby **ORDERED** that:

The Mayor's authority under D.C. Official Code § 1-204.22 to approve a realignment within an agency under the authority of the Mayor is hereby delegated as follows:

1. The City Administrator, Office of the City Administrator, shall have the authority to approve a proposed realignment of a District government agency under the personnel authority of the Mayor and may further delegate this function to a subordinate under his jurisdiction.
2. This Order applies to realignments within a District government department or agency that affect the internal structure or functions of the department or agency but do not constitute a reorganization. Realignment subject to this Order shall include changes that transfer functions, in whole or in part, from one subordinate element of a department or agency to another, consolidate all or part of the functions of one subordinate element of a department or agency with another, or abolish all or part of a subordinate element of a department or agency in conjunction with a transfer of the associated functions to one or more other subordinate elements of the department or agency.
3. This Order supersedes Mayor's Order 86-39, Approval Authority for Realignment, dated March 4, 1986.
4. **EFFECTIVE DATE:** This Order shall become effective immediately.

**SUBJECT:** Designation of Officers to Accept Service of Process on Behalf of the Mayor

**ORIGINATING AGENCY:** Office of the Mayor


By virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the District of Columbia by section 422(6) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act of 1973, as amended, 87 Stat. 790, P. L. No. 93-198, D.C. Official Code § 1-204.22(6), it is hereby **ORDERED** that:

1. **SERVICE OF PROCESS:**

- a. When the Mayor is sued, whether in an official or individual capacity, for acts or omissions arising from his or her official functions, the Attorney General is hereby designated to accept Service of Process on the Mayor's behalf.
- b. When the Mayor is served, not as a named party, but on behalf of the District of Columbia under Rule 4(j)(1) of the Superior Court Rules of Civil Procedure, the Attorney General is hereby designated to accept Service of Process on the Mayor's behalf.
- c. When the Mayor is served, not as a named party, but on behalf of the District of Columbia under Rule 4(j)(2) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, the Attorney General is hereby designated to accept Service of Process on the Mayor's behalf.
- d. Nothing in subparagraphs (a) through (c) of this section shall be construed to deny or limit a litigant's right to serve the Mayor under the Rule(s) applicable to civil actions filed in the Superior Court or the United States District Court for the District of Columbia.
- e. Whenever a business entity required to maintain a registered agent in the District of Columbia fails to appoint or maintain a registered agent in the District of Columbia, or whenever such registered agent cannot with reasonable diligence be found at the registered office, and the Mayor, therefore, has become an agent upon whom process may be served against the business entity, the Superintendent of Corporations at the District of Columbia Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs is hereby designated to accept Service of Process on the Mayor's behalf.

- f. All actions taken by the Department of Motor Vehicles for the Department of Public Works by accepting Service of Process on behalf of the Department of Public Works shall be ratified *nunc pro tunc* to March 26, 1999.
  - g. The Director of the Department of Motor Vehicles is hereby designated to accept Service of Process under section 7 of the Motor Vehicle Safety Responsibility Act of the District of Columbia, D.C. Official Code § 50-1301.07.
  - h. Each officer designated in this Order to accept Service of Process may delegate said authority to a responsible subordinate by filing with the Mayor and the Clerk of the Superior Court, the name, title, and address of said subordinate.
  - i. All actions heretofore taken by the Superintendent of Corporations on behalf of the Mayor to accept Service of Process on any corporation, limited liability company, or limited liability partnership are hereby ratified *nunc pro tunc* to July 23, 1991.
  - j. All prior Mayor's Orders and Mayor's Memoranda relating to the handling of Service of Process, including specifically Mayor's Order 2009-65, dated April 24, 2009, and Mayor's Order 91-130, as amended by Mayor's Order 2009-9, dated January 29, 2009, but not limited thereto, are hereby superseded to the extent of any inconsistency between such prior Orders and Memoranda and the terms of this Order.
2. **EFFECTIVE DATE:** This Order shall become effective immediately.

**SUBJECT:** Allocation of Spending (FY 2009)**ORIGINATING AGENCY:** Office of the Mayor

By virtue of the authority vested in the Mayor of the District of Columbia by sections 422, 422(11), 442(a)(1) and (c), and 603(d) and (e) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act of 1973, as amended, Pub. No. L. 93-198; D.C. Official Code §§ 1-204.22 and 1-204.22(11), 1-204.42(a)(1) and (c) and 1-206.03(d) and (e)), by the District of Columbia Appropriations Act, 2008, approved December 26, 2007 (Title IV of Division D of P.L. 110-161) and the General Provisions (Title VIII of Division D of P.L. 110-161), as extended by section 101 of the Continuing Appropriations Resolution, 2009, approved September 30, 2008 (P.L. 110-329), by sections 106, 134, and 135 of the Continuing Appropriations Resolution, 2009, by any subsequent congressional appropriations legislation for the District government during Fiscal Year 2009, by the federal Anti-deficiency Act (31 USC 1341 *et seq.*), by the District Anti-Deficiency Act of 2002, effective April 4, 2003 (D.C. Law 14-285; D.C. Official Code § 47-355.01 *et seq.*), and by Mayor's Order 88-16 (January 22, 1988) delegating authority to the City Administrator, it is hereby **ORDERED** that there is a policy established for allocating spending limits among the subordinate executive branch agencies of the District of Columbia government for the balance of FY 2009.

**I. Allocation of Spending**

The District faces a projected FY 2009 revenue shortfall of \$148,200,000 million, and the Office of the Chief Financial Officer plans to issue new revenue estimates in late June that may decrease revenues further for FY 2009. To prepare for the additional revenue shortfall, subordinate executive branch agency spending on non-personal services is hereby reduced by \$35,710,604 as listed on the attachment.

**II. Adjustments**

Upon the effective date of this Order, the Office of the Chief Financial Officer may adjust the allocations of spending limits made pursuant to this Order.

**III. Prohibitions**

- A. No officer or employee of the District of Columbia may make or authorize an expenditure, obligation, or personnel action that causes an agency to exceed the reduced spending limits established by this Order.

- B. Any officer or employee violating paragraph A, part III, of this Order shall be subject to appropriate administrative discipline recommended by the Board for Review of Anti-Deficiency Violations, including, when circumstances warrant, suspension from duty without pay or removal from office.
- IV. Applicability : This Order shall apply to all subordinate executive branch agencies of the District.
- V. **EFFECTIVE DATE:** This Order shall be effective immediately.

**SUBJECT:** Implementation of Spending Controls for All Subordinate Executive Branch Agencies

**ORIGINATING AGENCY:** Office of the Mayor

By virtue of the authority vested in the Mayor of the District of Columbia by sections 422, 422(11), 442(a)(1) and (c), and 603(d) and (e) of the Home Rule Act of 1973, as amended, Pub. L. No. 93-198; D.C. Official Code §§ 1-204.22 and 1-204.22(11), 1-204.42(a)(1) and (c) and 1-206.03(d) and (e)), and by delegated authority to the City Administrator by Mayor's Order 1988-16, dated January 30, 1988, it is hereby **ORDERED** that: a policy for limiting spending by subordinate executive branch agencies shall be implemented.

I. Policy

For the remainder of FY 2009, subordinate executive branch agencies may not make or authorize an expenditure, obligation, or personnel action that causes an agency to exceed the reduced spending limits. OCA may release some funding in exceptional cases after review of an agency spending plan prioritized by need. OCA will approve requests only for spending needs demonstrated to be critical.

II. Procedure

Agencies are encouraged to discuss spending plans with their OCA analyst prior to submission of any request. Agencies seeking OCA approval shall submit a spending plan that fully describes planned purchases and prioritizes them based on need. The OCA will notify the agency and the appropriate budget officer of the disposition of the request.

III. Applicability

This Order shall apply to all subordinate executive branch agencies of the District.
