The purpose of this hearing is to address the Jacks-Fogle Family Preservation Case Coordination Authorization Act of 2009, which seeks to authorize the Mayor to establish a case coordination system accessible to all government agencies that provide health and human services benefits, services, or supports and that will house protected health information relating to the agencies' programs for the purpose of improving the administration and management of the government public benefits, services or support programs, especially in situations where risk factors cross several health and human services agencies.
