## Notice of Reprogramming Request

Pursuant to DC Official Code Sec 47-361 et seq. of the Reprogramming Policy Act of 1990, the Council of the District of Columbia gives notice that the Mayor has transmitted the following reprogramming request(s)

A reprogramming will become effective on the 15<sup>th</sup> day after official receipt unless a Member of the Council files a notice of disapproval of the request which extends the Council's review period to 30 days. If such notice is given, a reprogramming will become effective on the 31<sup>st</sup> day after its official receipt unless a resolution of approval or disapproval is adopted by the Council prior to that time.

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**Reprog. 18-59:** Request to reprogram \$93,073,019 of dedicated taxes budget authority from Pay-as-you-go (Paygo) Capital fund to the Community Healthcare Financing Fund (CHFF) was filed in the Office of the Secretary on September 30, 2009. This reprogramming is needed to support FY 2009 and FY 2010 budget decisions and the FY 2010 financial plan and to enable the District to spend tobacco bond proceeds more rapidly before an FY 2011 Deadline.

**Reprog. 18-60:** Request to reprogram \$2,400,000 of Special Purpose Revenue funds budget authority within the Department on Disability Services (DDS) and from the Office of the Chief Financial Officer (OCFO) and the Department of Health Care Finance (DHCF) to DDS was filed in the Office of the Secretary on October 1, 2009. This reprogramming is to ensure that the Developmental Disabilities Administration (DDA) within DDS has sufficient funds to support residential and other direct services to eligible District residents with developmental disabilities.

**Reprog. 18-61:** Request to reprogram \$25,000 of Special Purpose Revenue budget authority from the Department of Consumer Regulatory Affairs (DCRA) was filed in the Office of the Secretary on October 1, 2009. This reprogramming will support additional revenue collection within D.C. Taxicab Commission's (DCTC) Fingerprinting Fund.

**Reprog. 18-62:** Request to reprogram \$2,234,907 of Local funds in the Department of Mental Health (DMH) was filed in the Office of the Secretary on October 1, 2009. This reprogramming will cover a budget shortfall in personnel costs in the St. Elizabeths Hospital program.

**Reprog. 18-63:** Request to reprogram \$900,000 of Special Purpose Revenue funds budget authority to the Department of Mental Health (DMH) from the Office of the Chief Financial Officer (OCFO) was filed in the Office of the Secretary on October 1, 2009. This reprogramming will allow DMH to spend collected revenue for the Federal Beneficiary Reimbursement and Medicare programs.

**Reprog. 18-64:** Request to reprogram \$13,000,000 in Special Purpose Revenue budget authority from the Unemployment Insurance Benefits for Ex-Military Services Personnel to the Continuing Unemployment Insurance Fund within the Unemployment Insurance Trust Fund for Fiscal Year 2009 was filed in the Office of the Secretary on October 1, 2009. This reprogramming is required due to increased filings of unemployment insurance benefits claims, and approval will allow for the extension of unemployment insurance benefits payments beyond the normal 26 weeks of authorized payments, as approved by the Federal Government.
