The Tenant Advisory Council is a body composed of tenant organizers, representatives of tenant associations, and other tenant advocates with no connection to commercial real estate interests. The TAC is currently responsible for monitoring and reporting on the progress of the Office of the Tenant Advocate. Bill 18-407, the "Tenant Advisory Council Clarification Amendment Act of 2009" would increase the duties of the Tenant Advisory Council to include the preparation of a report on its findings and recommendations that would be transmitted to the Mayor and to the Council for review.

Bill 18-484 requires the Office of the Tenant Advocate to produce a Tenant Bill of Rights that will clearly and concisely outline a tenant's rights, and detail how a tenant can locate more information and educational resources. The bill also requires landlords to provide the Tenant Bill of Rights at the time a lease is first presented to the tenant. Landlords who fail to provide the Bill or Rights will be subject to civil penalties.
