23 Budget Transparency Investigation Authorization Resolution of 2009”.
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26 Sec. 2. Background.

27 (a) The Committee on Libraries, Parks and Recreation finds that the circumstances
28 surrounding the transfer of authority and funds from the Department of Parks and Recreation’s
29 (“Department”) capital funds, as presented in the October 30, 2009 roundtable on The
30 Contracting Process of Parks and Recreation Projects, demonstrate inadequate controls and
31 accountability over the budget process. Further, the Committee finds that unanswered and
32 potentially inappropriate involvement of the Department and other District agencies into this
33 matter warrant the conduct of an investigation. For the purpose of this investigation, the
34 Chairperson of the Committee is authorized to issue subpoenas to compel a witness’s attendance,

1 to obtain testimony, and to produce documents, evidence, other information, or tangible items,
2 pursuant to the authority provided in section 413 of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act,
3 approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 789; D.C. Code § 1-204.13), and section 601(b) of the
4 Rules of Organization and Procedure for the Council of the District of Columbia, Council Period
5 XVIII.

6 (b) The Chairperson of the Committee is authorized to coordinate with any other
7 applicable Council Committee regarding this investigation.

8 Sec. 3. Investigation

9 The Committee on Libraries, Parks and Recreation will examine, and is authorized to
10 investigate the following:

11 (1) A determination of policies, procedures, or other practices surrounding the transfer of
12 funds or authority via memoranda of understanding, or any other instrumentality, for Department
13 of Parks and Recreation capital projects.

14 (2) All funds concerning Department of Parks and Recreation capital projects; and

15 (3) All relevant facts and circumstances related to the matters listed above to determine
16 what, if any, legislative action may be appropriate.

17 Sec. 4. Subpoena authorization.

18 The Committee is authorized to use subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses, to
19 obtain testimony, or to produce documents or other information or tangible items.

20 Sec. 5. Filing of the resolution.

21 The Committee Clerk of the Committee on Libraries, Parks and Recreation shall file this
22 resolution, upon its adoption, in the Office of the Secretary, in accordance with section 601(b) of

1 the Rules of Organization and Procedure for the Council of the District of Columbia, Council
2 Period XVIII.

3 Sec. 6. Effective date.

4 This resolution shall take effect immediately.

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
