Council Chairman Vincent C. Gray announces a public hearing by the Committee of the Whole on Bill 18-559, the "Reprogramming Policy Reform Act of 2009." The public hearing is scheduled for Tuesday, January 12, 2010, at 11:30 a.m., in the Council Chamber, Room 500 of the John A. Wilson Building, 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W.

Bill 18-559, introduced by Chairman Gray and Councilmembers Michael Brown, Mendelson, Cheh, Thomas, Evans, Catania, Kwame Brown, Graham, Barry, Wells, Bowser and Alexander, would amend Chapter 3 of Title 47 of the District of Columbia Official Code to reform reprogramming requirements and procedures and to establish requirements and procedures for intra-District transfers.

Councilmember Phil Mendelson, Chairperson of the Committee on Public Safety and the Judiciary, announces a public oversight roundtable on continuing overtime and pay problems in the Fire and Emergency Medical Services Department. The hearing will be held at 2:00 p.m. on December 21, 2009 in Hearing Room 123 of the John A. Wilson Building.

The purpose of the oversight roundtable is to hear and receive testimony on two issues. First, the Fire and Emergency Medical Services Department's management and control of overtime and pay problems. FEMS has overspent its overtime budget the last several years and is on track to do so again by approximately 100%. Second, FEMS continues to suffer pay problems that are detrimental to agency personnel. The roundtable will focus on what measures FEMS is undertaking to reduce the agency's use of overtime and correct ongoing problems with regard to pay. Testimony will be limited to these two issues. A similar roundtable was held on November 5, 2009, and the Committee will continue to hold these oversight hearings until these two problems are under control.
