On Monday, January 25, 2010, Councilmember Mary M. Cheh, Chairperson of the Committee on Government Operations and the Environment, and Councilmember Jack Evans, Chairperson of the Committee on Finance and Revenue, will hold a joint public hearing on Bill 18-580, the Energy Efficiency Financing Act of 2009. The purpose of the bill as introduced is to create a Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) program; to provide for the issuance, sale, and delivery of District of Columbia revenue bonds in one or more series, payable from special assessment revenues and issued pursuant to section 490 of the District of Columbia home Rule Act; and to authorize the Mayor to use the proceeds to provide funding for the initial installation of clean energy improvements. The joint public hearing will begin at 10:30 AM in Room 120 of the John A. Wilson Building, 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W.
