Councilmember Tommy Wells, Chair of the Committee on Human Services, announces a Public Hearing on Bill 18-0529 "Safe Children and Safe Neighborhood Educational Neglect Mandatory Reporting Amendment Act of 2010". The bill was co-introduced by Councilmembers Tommy Wells and Phil Mendelson and referred to the Committee on Human Services.

The Public Hearing on the bill will be held on Friday, March 19, 2010 at 1:00 p.m. in Room 123 of the John A. Wilson Building, 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20004.

Bill 18-0529 "Safe Children and Safe Neighborhood Educational Neglect Mandatory Reporting Amendment Act of 2010" requires mandatory reporters to report a child between the ages of 5 and 13 to the Child and Family Services Agency (CFSA) if the child accumulates 10 days of unexcused absences in a year.

In part, the Bill reestablishes a public policy that existed under a prior regulation that, within 2 years of being implemented, resulted in attendance improvement rates for elementary school children of at least 50%. Through the mandatory reporting requirement, the Bill represents a critical opportunity to support parents early, with vital family-based services, as opposed to imposing penalty-like consequences after the fact.

The stated purpose of Bill 18-660 is to amend Title 16 of the District of Columbia Official Code to change the requirement of the Domestic Violence Fatality Review Board submitting an annual report to the public, Mayor, and Council from mandatory to optional; and to repeal the sunset provision.

Bill 18-619, the "UNCF Tax Abatement and Relocation to the District Assistance Act of 2010", was introduced by Chairman Vincent C. Gray at the request of the Mayor. It would provide for an abatement of real property taxes on real property owned and used by UNCF, and to provide a relocation assistance grant of up to \$710,000.

Bill 18-520, the "Shirley's Place Equitable Real Property Tax Relief Act of 2009", was introduced by Councilmember Tommy Wells and would provide real property tax relief to the Capitol Hill Group Ministry, a tax-exempt nonprofit organization for back taxes covering the years 1999, 2000, 2006, and 2008.

Bill 18-669, the "SOME, Inc. Technical Amendments Act of 2010", was introduced by Councilmembers Marion Barry and Jack Evans and would clarify the corporate name of SOME and clarify that the tax exemptions for these properties are contingent upon appropriate use restrictions during the federal low-income housing tax credit compliance period.

Bill 18-658, the "District Job Growth Incentive Act of 2010", was introduced by all thirteen Members of the Council, and would create a District job growth tax credit incentive to encourage business to hire District residents as new employees. The credit would be applicable if a business adds 10 or more such new jobs.

PR 18-748, "American Society of Nephrology Revenue Bonds Project Approval

Resolution of 2010, was introduced by Chairman Gray at the request of the Mayor and would authorize and provide for the issuance, sale, and delivery in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$7.9 million of District of Columbia revenue bonds in one or more series and to authorize and provide for the loan of the proceeds of such bonds to assist The American Society of Nephrology in the financing, refinancing, or reimbursing of costs associated with an authorized project pursuant to section 490 of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act. Proceeds of the bonds will be used for acquiring, constructing, renovating, furnishing and equipping a new headquarter facility, including all or portions of floors 7 and 8, a pro rata share of the common elements, and 5 parking spaces at property located at 1510 H Street, N.W., in Ward 2.

Monthly reports also are available on the Office of Public Education Facilities Modernization (OPEFM) website ([www.opefm.dc.gov](http://www.opefm.dc.gov)). These documents provide progress reports for projects underway and descriptions of projects completed in 2007 – 2009. An updated proposal is expected to be placed on the OPEFM website prior to the hearing. Issues in the approval of the plan include: provision of scopes, cost estimates and schedules for projects proposed; discussion of educational plans that should guide the design; and policies on prioritization, maintenance, and other issues impacting the building program.
