**Notice of Reprogramming Disapproval**

Councilmember Barry filed on March 17, 2010 PR 18-785. The "Reprogramming No. 18-102 of Disapproval Resolution of 2010" to Disapprove Reprogramming 18-102. The request to reprogram \$33,381,404 of capital budget authority and allotment between various capital projects to facilitate the completion of final Bearing Point reconciliation adjustments was filed in the Office of the Secretary on March 3, 2010. This reprogramming is necessary to ensure that remaining project budgets are realigned with budget corrections required following a study of historical budgets in the financial system of record (SOAR) and actual appropriated amounts.

The disapproval resolution extends the Council's review period to 30 days, ending on Monday, April 12, 2010. If the Council does not adopt a resolution of approval or disapproval during this period, the reprogramming will be deemed approved on Tuesday, April 13, 2010.

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**Reprog. 18-103:** Request to reprogram \$3,500,000 of capital budget authority and allotment from the Fire and Emergency Medical Services Department to the Office of the Deputy Mayor for Planning and Economic Development was filed in the Office of the Secretary on March 9, 2010. This reprogramming is necessary to fund a contract with Waterfront Associates, LLC, for construction of 4<sup>th</sup> Street, SW, through the former Waterside Mall site.
