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21 RESOLVED, BY THE COMMITTEE ON LIBRARIES, PARKS AND RECREATION,
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23 That this resolution may be cited as the "Committee on Libraries, Parks and Recreation
24 Budget Transparency Investigation Amendment Resolution of 2010".
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27 Sec. 2. The Committee on Libraries, Parks and Recreation Budget Transparency
28 Investigation Authorization Resolution of 2009, effective November 2, 2009 (56 DCR 8724) is
29 amended by adding a new section 3a. to read as follows:

30 "Sec. 3a. Appointment of Special Counsel.

31 "(a) The Committee on Libraries, Parks and Recreation appoints as Special
32 Counsel, Robert P. Trout, a partner at Trout Cacheris, PLLC ("Firm"), to assist in conducting this
33 investigation into the transfer of these funds, the awarding of subsequent contracts, and the
34 thorough review of District laws on a *pro bono* basis.

35 "(b) The Chairman of the Committee on Libraries, Parks and Recreation may

1 retain and delegate investigative duties authorized under this resolution to Mr. Trout.

2 “(c) As part of the investigation the Special Counsel shall:

3 “(1) Review all material he deems appropriate concerning this
4 investigation;

5 “(2) Conduct a thorough review of District laws to determine if the
6 circumstances surrounding the transfer of capital funds, the subsequent
7 awarding of contracts, or the approval and expenditure of funds warrant
8 further review of the United States Attorney for the District of Columbia
9 or any other investigative or enforcement agency;

10 “(3) Make any recommendations that he may have for any
11 necessary changes to District law;

12 “(4) Examine any other areas or matters that may be necessary to
13 assist the Committee as determined by the Chairman; and

14 “(5) Shall present a final report to the Committee within 60 days of
15 the conclusion of the investigation, and submit all official records of the
16 investigation to the Secretary to the Counsel within 30 days of filing his
17 final report.

18 “(d) The Special Counsel is authorized to delegate the duties of the Special Counsel to
19 attorneys of his firm as he deems appropriate.

20 “(e) The Special Counsel is permitted, through the Committee, to utilize subpoenas to
21 obtain testimony and documents.

1 “(f) The Special Counsel, or a delegate of the Special Counsel, may take testimony of
2 witnesses by oral, written, or videotaped depositions.”.

3 Sec. 3. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
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Notice of Reprogramming Disapproval

Councilmember Barry filed on April 9, 2010 PR 18-799. The "Reprogramming No. 18-110 Disapproval Resolution of 2010" to Disapprove Reprogramming 18-110. The request to reprogram \$4,065,495 of FY 2010 Dedicated Tax budget authority within the Department of Health Care Finance (DHCF) was filed in the Office of the Secretary on March 19, 2010. This reprogramming request realigns Dedicated Tax budget authority within the Healthy DC Fund program and to Employer and Private Market Initiative Program (EPMIP).

The disapproval resolution extends the Council's review period to 30 days, ending on Friday, April 30, 2010. If the Council does not adopt a resolution of approval or disapproval during this period, the reprogramming will be deemed approved on Saturday, May 1, 2010.

The request to reprogram \$1,000,000 FY 2010 Special Purpose Revenue (SPR) budget authority from the Department of Corrections (DOC) to the Department of Mental Health (DMH) was filed in the Office of the Secretary on March 19, 2010. This reprogramming is needed to meet St. Elizabeths Hospital (SEH) needs for staff training, contracted medical and professional services, and maintenance of the physical plant.
