PR 18-848, the "Arts and Technology Academy: A Public Charter School Refunding Revenue Bonds Project Approval Resolution of 2010", introduced by Chairman Gray at the request of the Mayor and would authorize and provide for the issuance, sale, and delivery in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$8 million of District of Columbia revenue bonds in one or more series and to authorize and provide for the loan of the proceeds of such bonds to assist the Arts and Technology Academy: A Public Charter School in the financing, refinancing, or reimbursing of costs associated with an authorized project pursuant to section 490 of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act. Proceeds of the bonds will be used to finance and

refinance costs associated with the renovations to the existing school building and related grounds located at 5300 Blaine Street, N.E., in Ward 7.

PR 18-849, "The Catholic University of America Revenue Bonds Project Approval Resolution of 2010", introduced by Chairman Gray at the request of the Mayor and would authorize and provide for the issuance, sale, and delivery in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$50 million of District of Columbia revenue bonds in one or more series and to authorize and provide for the loan of the proceeds of such bonds to assist The Catholic University of America in the financing, refinancing, or reimbursing of costs associated with an authorized project pursuant to section 490 of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act. Proceeds of the bonds will be used to finance and refinance costs associated with the construction of the law center and renovations of academic buildings, and the acquisition of property adjacent to the main campus located at 620 Michigan Avenue, N.E., in Ward 5.

PR 18-850, the "National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund, Inc., Revenue Bonds Project Approval Resolution of 2010", introduced by Chairman Gray at the request of the Mayor and would authorize and provide for the issuance, sale, and delivery in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$60 million of District of Columbia revenue bonds in one or more series and to authorize and provide for the loan of the proceeds of such bonds to assist the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund in the financing, refinancing, or reimbursing of costs associated with an authorized project pursuant to section 490 of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act. Proceeds of the bonds will be used to finance and refinance costs associated with the construction design furnishing and equipping an approximately 53,000 square foot national law enforcement museum to be located at 444 E Street, N.W., in Ward 6.

B18-198, the "Allen Chapel A.M.E. Senior Residential Rental Project Property Tax Exemption and Equitable Real Property Tax Relief Act of 2009" introduced by Councilmember Barry, would amend Chapter 10 of Title 47 to exempt from taxation certain property by Allen Chapel African Methodist Episcopal Church, Inc. and its affiliates, which is to be developed as low-income senior housing; and to provide for equitable real property tax relief for Allen Chapel.

Bill 18-289, the "Mission First Development Property Tax Relief Amendment Act of 2009", introduced by Councilmember Barry, would amend Chapter 10 of Title 47 to exempt from taxation certain property owned by Mission First Development and its affiliates, which is to be developed as extremely low-income housing; and to provide for equitable real property tax relief for Mission First Development.

Bill 18-505, the "Wayne Place Senior Living Limited Partnership Real Property Tax Exemption Act of 2009", introduced by Councilmember Barry, would amend Chapter 10 of Title 47 to provide a real property tax exemption to real property located at lot 0045 in square 6118, property of Wayne Place Senior Living Limited Partnership.

Bill 18-749, the "King Towers Residential Housing Real Property Tax Exemption Act of 2010"; was introduced by Councilmember Evans and would amend Chapter 46 of Title 47 to exempt from taxation certain property owned by King Housing LLC or its affiliate which is to be rehabilitated as affordable and low-income housing.

Bill 18-774, the "Universal Holiness Church Real Property Tax Relief Act of 2010.", introduced by Councilmember Barry, would amend Chapter 46 of Title 47 to forgive real property taxes owed and exempted from taxation certain property of the Universal Holiness Church, a tax-exempt organization located in Lot 0874, Square 5877, in Ward 8.
