The public hearing will be held at 11:00 a.m. on Monday, June 7, 2010 in the Council Chamber of the John A. Wilson Building.

The stated purpose of Bill 18-763 is to establish a nine member Commission on Juvenile Justice Reform in the District of Columbia to build a transparent and unified juvenile justice system based on mutual accountability, coordination of resources and information sharing.

Council Chairman Vincent C. Gray announces a public hearing by the Committee of the Whole on Bill 18-801, the "Closing of Public Streets and a Public Alley and Dedication and Designation of Land for Street Purposes in Squares 3765, 3767, 3768, and 3769 Act of 2010." The public hearing is scheduled for Wednesday, June 9, 2010, at 1:00 pm, in Room 412 of the John A. Wilson Building, 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, NW.

Bill 18-801, introduced by Councilmember Harry Thomas, Jr., would close: 1) a portion of Hamilton Street NE, between South Dakota Avenue NE and the 20-foot-wide public alley running between 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Streets NE, in Squares 3767 and 3768; 2) a portion of 4<sup>th</sup> Street NE between Galloway Street NE and a point immediately north of Hamilton Street NE; 3) a public alley in Square 3769; and 4) a portion of the public alley in Square 3765; all located in Ward 5. The applicant is the Cafritz Foundation, which seeks these closings to facilitate the development of an approximately 805,000 square foot residential/retail/office building planned for the southernmost portion of a 16.5 acre site owned by the applicant near the Fort Totten Metrorail Station, located along South Dakota Avenue extending from Galloway Street NE on the south across Kennedy Street NE on the north. This building will contain approximately 527,000 square feet of multi-family residential use (510-550 units), including housing for existing tenants being relocated on-site as part of the redevelopment, and including dedicated housing for senior citizens. The building also would contain approximately 110,000 square feet of retail uses (some below-grade) including space for a grocery store. A child care facility measuring 7,250 square feet is also proposed for this building, along with approximately 681 underground and structured parking spaces.

**Councilmember Tommy Wells, Chair of the Committee on Human Services, announces a Public Oversight Roundtable on “Discussion on Abscondence and DYRS Youth in Community-Based Placements”.** The roundtable will be held on Friday, May 21, 2010, at 2:00 p.m. in the Room 412 of the John A. This roundtable has been scheduled to discuss the issue of abscondence in light of the recent shooting that allegedly occurred by youth under the custody of DYRS who absconded from their community placement. The Department of Youth Rehabilitation Services (DYRS) will be given this opportunity to provide their definition of abscondence for the public, explain how the abscondence rate for the agency is obtained, share the agency's current abscondence protocol, and identify ways to effectively work with all the District's juvenile justice partners to address this community safety concern.
