

Notice of Reprogramming Disapproval

Councilmember Barry filed on May 19, 2010 PR 18-894. The "Reprogramming No. 18-117 Disapproval Resolution of 2010" to Disapprove Reprogramming 18-117. The request to reprogram \$2,731,575 of Fiscal Year 2010 Local fund budget authority from the Repayment of loans and Interest agency (DS0) to the Office of the Chief Technology Officer (OCTO) was filed in the Office of the Secretary on May 5, 2010. This reprogramming is needed because in FY 2008, OCTO began the project of relocating data center services from a legacy data center facility (ODC2) to a new facility with infrastructure and redundancy required to support the District's critical agency and enterprise technology services.

The disapproval resolution extends the Council's review period to 30 days, ending on Friday, June 4, 2010. If the Council does not adopt a resolution of approval or disapproval during this period, the reprogramming will be deemed approved on Saturday, June 5, 2010.

Notice of Reprogramming Disapproval

Councilmember Barry filed on May 19, 2010 PR 18-895. The "Reprogramming No. 18-116 Disapproval Resolution of 2010" to Disapprove Reprogramming 18-116. The request to reprogram \$2,836,125 of capital budget within the Office of Chief Financial Officer (OCFO) was filed in the Office of the Secretary on May 5, 2010. This reprogramming is necessary to ensure budget is available for the accounting, and potentially the budgeting, modules of upgraded software to replace the SOAR system, including purchase and implementation.

The disapproval resolution extends the Council's review period to 30 days, ending on Friday, June 4, 2010. If the Council does not adopt a resolution of approval or disapproval during this period, the reprogramming will be deemed approved on Saturday, June 5, 2010.

Councilmembers Barry and Thomas, Jr. filed on May 19, 2010 PR 18-896. The "Reprogramming No. 18-114 Disapproval Resolution of 2010" to Disapprove Reprogramming 18-114. The request to reprogram \$854,041 of capital budget authority and allotment within the Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR) was filed in the Office of the Secretary on May 5, 2010. This reprogramming is necessary to support critical staff tasked with providing oversight for internal projects and improvement.

The disapproval resolution extends the Council's review period to 30 days, ending on Friday, June 4, 2010. If the Council does not adopt a resolution of approval or disapproval during this period, the reprogramming will be deemed approved on Saturday, June 5, 2010.
