Councilmember David A. Catania, Chair of the Committee on Health, announces a Public Hearing on B18-127, the Blood Donation Expansion Act of 2009. The hearing will be Tuesday, July 6, 2010 at 2:00 p.m. in Room 123 of the John Wilson Building, 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, NW.

The purpose of the hearing is to consider a bill that requires the Department of Health to issue rules allowing for the donation of blood by minors age sixteen (16) if they have the written consent of a parent or legal guardian and they meet all other health standards for blood donation.

Testimony may be limited to 3 minutes per witness and 5 minutes for a panel of witnesses. Councilmember Phil Mendelson, Chairperson of the Committee on Public Safety and the Judiciary, announces a public oversight roundtable on continuing overtime and pay problems in the Fire and Emergency Medical Services Department.
