Councilmember Muriel Bowser, Chair of the Committee on Public Services and Consumer Affairs, announces a Public Hearing on Bill 18-451: Artist Protection Act. The hearing will be held on Wednesday, September 22, 2010, at 11:00 a.m. in the Council Chamber, Room 500 of the John A. Wilson Building, 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, NW.

**Bill 18-451: Artist Protection Act** would protect artists in transactions for works of art. Under current District law, works of art owned by artists but in the possessions of galleries can be seized by creditors of the gallery. Passage of this bill would place the District in the company of more than two dozen states that have statutes that govern consignments of works of art with galleries. Specifically, the bill would clarify that works of art loaned to galleries are not subject to the gallery's creditors, and offer other protections.

Members of the public are invited to testify. Testimony may be limited to 3 minutes per witness and 5 minutes for organizations. Each person presenting oral testimony may be limited to THREE (3) minutes in order to permit each witness an opportunity to be heard.
